Access Requirements: The CCA is on the military installation, USAG-Miami and the home of the U.S. Southern Command. Access to USAG-Miami & USSOUTHCOM Facility requires a valid Common Access Card (CAC), military ID, and/or Government-issued Personal Identity Verification card (Gov PIV). Course participants who do not have one of these forms of ID must be placed on roster and the roster provided to the USSOUTHCOM host POC identified in this instruction no later than 13 February 2014. A Visitor Authorization Request (VAR) is not required.

Entry at the installation requires only a valid picture ID (e.g., driver's license.) It is recommended you have a second form of identification on hand. Those personnel names will be provided to the installation security officers to verify need for entry and smooth entry. Personnel without DoD identification must enter Gate 2 on the installation west entry point.

Parking: No Parking Restrictions. Do not park in a reserved location, or van pool space as marked.

Attendance: Students are required to attend all scheduled classes unless absence is excused by the class manager. Students will not be released prior to graduation except under emergency conditions. If the registered student is unable to attend the class his supervisor should email the DISAM IPSRC POC prior to the 1st day of the class or sooner. DoD activities are subject to pay for the cost of the student materials for any no-shows.

Dress Code: Civilians Business Casual and/or Casual in good taste are acceptable. Casual dress is defined as slacks and open collar shirts for men and dresses, slacks or skirt and blouses for women. Military wear their respective duty uniform. **This does not include tank tops, shorts, tennis shoes, jeans, etc.** Classroom temperatures may vary in the classroom. Light sweater or jacket is recommended. Miami average high is 75 and low is 63 degrees.

Turn RIGHT on NW 33rd ST (Tony Roma's Restaurant is on the corner)

Proceed West and Turn Right in to the Second (West) USSOUTHCOM Entrance Gate

Show the Gate Guard your Government ID card and Rental Car Agreement for entry

If you have no Government ID, expect to have your car searched and get a pass at the gate
