Location:	The IPSR Course to be conducted 21-23 April 2015, will be held at the MIDS Program Office, Conference Room 301, located in Building 17B of the Naval Mine and Anti-Submarine Warfare Command (NMAWC) in San Diego, CA. NMAWC is located on North Harbor Drive, one-half mile west of San Diego International Airport
Access Requirements:	All vehicles and pedestrian visitors must access NMAWC via the main gate located at the intersection of North Harbor Drive and Laning Road NMAWC Base Access: All visitors must have an identification card (Common Access Card (CAC), Military ID) to present to the gate sentry to access the NMAWC facility
Parking:	On-base parking is limited Unmarked parking spaces are available for general parking The lot around the Admiral Kidd Conference Center is reserved for conference center guests. An overflow parking lot is located across Harbor Drive from the NMAWC Driving west on North Harbor Drive, turn right just before reaching the pedestrian bridge. The overflow lot is secured by an automated gate, open 0500-1800.


	<p>After-hours ENTRY requires a NMAWC coded CAC (coding at main gate before 0900) After-hours EXIT: drive toward the gate and it will open automatically (CAC not required)</p> <p>To walk from the overflow lot to Building 17A: Cross the pedestrian bridge over North Harbor Drive, then: Using your previously coded CAC, enter the base via the turnstile and proceed to Building 17A as instructed below or Walk east along North Harbor Drive to the Main Gate at the intersection of North Harbor Drive and Laning Road</p> <p>Upon entry onto the base, follow McConnell Road (parallels North Harbor Drive) until you reach the flag pole. Building 17B will be ahead of you and to the left, beside building 17A, (next to the DAU building) Take the stairs to the 3rd floor and check-in with the reception Allow approximately 15 minutes to walk from the overflow lot to Building 17B via the main gate</p>
<p>Attendance:</p>	<p>Students are required to attend all scheduled classes unless absence is excused by the class manager of the class. Students will not be released prior to graduation except under emergency conditions. If the registered student is unable to attend the class his supervisor should email the DISAM IPSRC POC prior to the 1st day of the class or sooner. DoD activities are subject to pay for the cost of the student materials for any no-shows...</p>
<p>Dress Code:</p>	<p>Casual dress is acceptable. Casual dress is defined as slacks and sport shirts for men and slacks or skirts and blouses for women. NMAWC Tips	<p><u>Military Colors:</u> Morning Colors are carried out every morning at 0800 followed by the playing of the National Anthem. Evening Colors are carried out daily at sunset. While on base, as a sign of respect, pedestrians and vehicles alike are expected to stop, turn in the direction of the Flag and remain stopped until colors has concluded and the “all clear” signal is sounded</p> <p><u>Emergency Mustering location:</u> In case of emergencies requiring evacuation of the building, the MPO’s mustering location is along the fence behind the flag pole</p> <p><u>Pedestrian Bridge Access:</u> Visitors who parked in the overflow lot can enter NMAWC via the pedestrian turnstile located at the base of the pedestrian bridge over Harbor Drive, rather than walking back through the main gate. If visiting for more than one day and in possession of a CAC, you may stop at the Main Gate guard shack to have your CAC encoded for pedestrian turnstile access</p>
